- TSM – Technical Safety Management system in Germany, in charge of energy, gas, water supply, wastewater and rivers.
 - Who is in charge?
 - Why is it needed?
- How are infrastructures organized and financed

Next to the overview on the German system, examples of adaptations and transfer possibilities to various countries will be covered.

The participants will gain an understanding of the work of associations, the regulator and the operator. Group work, show cases and discussions are the basis of the seminar.
